C. Introductions

- Roundtable. Denise English thanked Michele Rowe and **St. Andrews United Church & Centre for Peace** for hosting the meeting.

D. Updates on Items from Last Meeting

- 1. New Horizons for Seniors Funding Program
- Golden Seniors Centre: Access to the building/automated doors. AED. Application has been received.
- Connie circulated a provincial link for grants. Announcement for AFCP funding has not been issued (likely September). 25 grants up to \$25K for BC. Funding from BC MoH, "light on capital" funding, heavy on programing. Eg. Could cover transportation \$ to get seniors to other programing.
- Denise suggests looking at the priorities of the AFCP before developing a project proposal (see GoldenLoom.ca).

2. Officially recognition of Golden as an Age Friendly Community by AFBC

- AFBC suggested an event or small project (like a bench) or AFCP signage (locations and types).
- The Town of Golden has received the \$1,000 and has hung the poster in Council Chambers.
- Draft request: "Given that many volunteers contributed to the creation of an AFCP for Golden, the AFCC would recommend that the \$1,000 from AFBC go to an age friendly project, like a covered bench in Spirit Square or other suitable location."
- Denise English will finalize and submit the request to Council.

- 3. Guest Speaker: Bill Barger, BC Community Response Networks (BCCRNS)
- Presentation: Elder Abuse Awareness Training

- BCCRNS is a provincially funned organization, focused on developing and supporting response networks for vulnerable adults (18+ years of age)
- We are welcome to join the provincial BCCRNS and local BCCRN out of Cranbrook.
- Will share presentations and resources. Will provide training for others.
- Bill provided an overview of "See it. Name it. Check it." elder abuse program
- Guiding Principles: 1) Broad inclusion, 2) Meaningful participation, 3) Power-sharing, 4) Assume ability/build capacity.
- Training opportunity for future presenters: Vernon, in the fall.
- CRNs develop a coordinator response through workshops, increased professional awareness, community-focused committee/team (flexible structure to adjust with the changing issues, circumstances). Members could include police, churches, community service organizations, etc.
- "It's not right" is the presentation for the public.
- Police are a large source of referrals, as are the general public.
- CRNs are in Creston, Cranbrook; starting in Fernie with the Salvation Army, Better at Homes in Invermere.

- This plan takes the Committee from project idea to application.

5. Event & Program Calendars Committee

- Connie, Tanis, Ryan & Ruth H are on the committee. Connie provided a verbal report.
- Calendar Input: All age friendly related programs & services
- Format: Online input → collaborative printing/distribution
- Connie met with Ruth from the Chamber of Commerce
- CVCU has contributed \$1,500 towards the calendar, along with a few other businesses.
- **Action:** 1st Calendar will likely come out in October. Public recognition of donors will occur with the 1st Calendar.
- Action: The Committee will look into including this calendar in The Golden Star & Golden Weekly.

6. Access to Care Committee (update from Mickey)

- Letter to the Editor was published in Golden Star last week
- Issues & Solutions Table
- UBCM & other communities
- Action: Like and engage on "Keep Medical Services Local" on Facebook Community page.
- J-G has shared some local healthcare data.
- Action: Mickey Balas is collecting local healthcare stories. Eg. One patient was transported 1,274km over 3 days. Stories will be sent to the MLA (Norm Macdonald) and Minister of Health (Terry Lake) as they come in. Mel Myers and Mickey will look at a disclosure/release form for volunteering patients.
- Local physicians are collecting anonymous data on care pathways and the challenges with them.
- Collaboration between Golden, Invermere and Nelson local elected officials is being encouraged by Ryan Watmough and Kerri Wall so that they can present a unified and prioritized front at UBCM and meetings with Minister of Health Terry Lake.

7. Seniors Helping Seniors Committee (update from Jan)

- Jan Rodman is working with Joel Tansey at The Golden Star toward increasing the awareness of seniors-focused programs.
- Better At Home program, 67 communities involved in a pilot project across BC. Ryan will hear
 from the program manager to determine if Golden can participate before 2017 the next
 official intake. If necessary, a letter to the MLA and Minister of Health will be written requesting
 support.
- There are a number of different initiatives from nearby communities that we can look toward to solve local issues.

8. Transportation Committee

- No activity to report.

9. Durand Manor Renovation Project (update from Tanis)

- Annie Hammond fund to replace "round room" and increase it 1.5x.
- Courtyard and sidewalks may also be examined and a larger community project developed.
- The ground-breaking is scheduled for December.
- There will be a meeting with IH staff on September 15th, 9am. Contact Ryan if you want to attend.

10. Seniors Advocate/Navigator

- This is a 'need,' but there are no resources currently available.
- Mickey will continue to work on it.
