



Today & Tomorrow: Two Curves Theory of Change



Some systems are peaking or have peaked.

That system also drives out individuals.

Some organizations don't know how to change, evolve, celebrate their successes or die with dignity. There is an after life.

Agents of Change are emerging.

New organizations & networks are being created (CCC).

These organizations form communities of practice.

Eventually, a new system is created.




