FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

FEDERAL:

Call 1-800-277-9914 or visit the Service Canada website at: www.servicecanada.gc.ca Pick up forms at the Post Office.

Old Age Security (OAS)

A monthly pension paid once a resident is 65 years or older. To receive OAS, apply at least 6 months before your 65th birthday.

Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS)

When you file your income tax return, the GIS provides additional money on top of OAS for seniors living on a lower income.

Allowance

For the spouse or common-law partner of someone receiving both the OAS and GIS.

Allowance for the Survivor

For those whose spouse or common-law partner has passed away, this benefit provides additional money until aged 65.

Canada Pension Plan (CPP)

For those who have contributed to the plan through paid employment in Canada. To receive CPP, apply at least 6 months before you want to receive it. The earliest the pension can be received is age 60.

Employment Insurance Benefits (EI)

Seniors who continue working after age 65 are eligible for the same El benefits as other workers in Canada if they meet the required conditions.

Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC)

Assistance to elderly veterans and caregivers, such as disability benefits, attendance allowances, health care, home care, respite, palliative care, special equipment and home adaptations.

Remember, to access most programs it is very important to file your income tax return on time!

PROVINCIAL:

Senior's Supplement

For low-income seniors who are receiving GIS and OAS if their income is below a certain level. Paid automatically when you file your income tax return.

Income Assistance (IA)

For those seniors not eligible for OAS or the GIS. Eligibility is based on income, assets, and shelter cost. Phone: 1-866-866-0800 (press 3, then 1).

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SERVICES:

Occupational Therapists help clients who may be having difficulty with daily activities. Assessment and assistance might include:

- Self Care dressing, grooming, bathing, toileting, selffeeding and swallowing
- Mobility need for aids such as wheelchairs, scooters and walkers
- Transfers need for equipment and/or education on safe techniques
- Pressure Wound Management input on positioning and pressure relief mattresses or wheelchair cushions, as an adjunct to nursing care
- Simple Splints for support
- Cognition assessment regarding the impact of cognitive changes on clients' safety or ability to manage independently

Adult Day Program

For clients still living at home who may be at risk of losing their independence, a variety of supportive programs and activities in a comfortable group setting – includes personal care services, such as bathing, rehabilitation, nutrition, therapeutic recreation, caregiver respite, education & support, and social activities.

Assisted Living

For eligible seniors and adults who need more help to remain independent, but who do not need 24-hour professional care in a residential facility. Includes such services as: two meals a day, medication reminders, scheduled bathing, housekeeping, social & recreational activities, 24-hour response service.

Community Care Nursing

For acute, chronic or palliative support, home care registered nurses administer medications, change dressings, provide education about self-care, and do assessment for all continuing care services.

Home Support Service

For people who need help managing personal health care needs such as bathing, using the toilet, and getting up and dressing – designed to supplement rather than replace the support of loved ones.



Palliative Care

Palliative, or end-of-life, care provides supportive and compassionate care for the dying. This care is provided in hospital, assisted living, residential care, or at home. Includes: professional nursing, rehabilitation, home support, respite care, counselling, bereavement and grief support.

Ask Home Care about the BC Palliative Care Benefits Program.

Residential Care

For people with complex health care needs who require 24-hour professional care, and need continuous care due to physical, mental and behavioural conditions who are unable to continue living safely at home. Available either on a short-term or permanent basis. Those with the greatest need have priority over others.



Respite

Gives non-professional caregivers who look after a loved one temporary relief. Adult day service program or facility-based care provided on a short-term basis.



The income limits vary, depending on the community and number of bedrooms in the unit. Assets must also be limited. IF YOU OWN YOUR HOME:

Home Adaptations for Seniors' Independence Program (HASI):

Financial assistance for homeowners and landlords to pay for minor home adaptations to extend the time that low-income seniors can live in their own homes independently. Maximum assistance available is \$3,500 and is intended to cover adaptations such as handrails, and bathtub grab bars.

This grant reduces the amount of property tax paid on the primary residence of those aged 65 and over.

LEGAL TERMS:

Power of Attorney

A legal document that gives another person the power to make decisions regarding your legal or financial matters. This can be general or quite specific. It is usually done when a person is physically unable to look after their affairs due to travel or injury, illness, disease or accident.

Representation Agreement

A legal document that appoints someone to make decisions for you about finances, health and/or personal care matters, if you are incapable of making decisions independently for whatever reason. You can choose when or under what circumstances you want the agreement to start. You can also choose different representatives to make different decisions. For example, you may choose your daughter to handle your banking and your son to make medical decisions.



LEGAL TERMS:

Wills

A document that explains what you want done with the assets that you own solely in your own name, when you die. A will is also your statement on who and what is important to you. It is very important to consult a professional and make a will properly as it is a complex legal document.

When making legal decisions it is very important to consult a trusted legal advisor!

ADULT ABUSE AND NEGLECT:

Community Response Network (CRN)

A diverse group of concerned community members and agencies working under the Adult Guardianship Act that respond to adult abuse, neglect, and self-neglect for people aged 19 years and older and coordinate with designated agencies to address situations when individuals are not able to seek help on their own. Individuals have the right to:

- Be treated with respect
- Have access to basic needs
- Have protection from neglect
- Have protection from physical, emotional, financial or sexual abuse
- Information about civil and legal rights,
- Have control over their lives

CONSUMER PROTECTION:
